The Laureate Award honors Fellows and Masters of the American College of Physicians Colorado Chapter who have demonstrated, by their example and conduct, an abiding commitment to excellence in medical care, education, or research and service to their community, their chapter, and the American College of Physicians. The recipient of this award shall bear the title of Laureate of the Colorado Chapter.

The Colorado Chapter of the American College of Physicians Volunteerism and Community Service Award honors members who volunteer exceptional time and energy to improve the health and welfare of their community or of the world at large. Activities might include work in community-based clinics, health education, health advocacy, and sponsorship initiatives for underrepresented physicians or patients.

This award honors an early-career physician in internal medicine who is within 16 years of graduating medical school. The physician must be highly respected by colleagues for outstanding clinical skills and for being a role model in the community. The nominee should have distinguished service to patients, the physician community, and the community at large. The nominee should be an educator to patients or the community. Ideally, the physician would be an ACP member at the time of nomination; if not, the physician must become a member in order to receive the award.

This award honors a Member, Fellow, or Master of the American College of Physicians Colorado Chapter who has demonstrated a steady and strong commitment to promote equitable access to safe, high quality healthcare for all members of the public along with a devotion to build a better future for medicine.

This award honors a Member, Fellow, or Master of the American College of Physicians Colorado Chapter who has demonstrated an enduring commitment to outstanding teaching and mentorship of students, residents, fellows, or colleagues as evidenced by a sustained commitment to medical education, professionalism, and excellence in the practice of medicine.

This award honors members of the American College of Physicians Colorado Chapter who excel in the practice and teaching of internal medicine outside a major metropolitan area, particularly those working in settings with limited access to advanced medical technology and specialty care.
